Free SEC Revision Classes (A Youth Guarantee Initiative)



Jobsplus, Malta



2014 - ongoing

Objective: To provide essential academic support for students (15 to 29) who did not pass their SEC/Ordinary exams, aiding participants in their preparation for resit exams and reducing the risk of long-term NEET status.

Target group: youths aged 15 to 29 who did not pass their SEC/Ordinary Level exams.

Key components of the practice:

The EU funded the program through the European Social Fund as part of the Youth Guarantee Policy Offers.

- **Tailored support** five weeks of free morning classes covering core subjects such as English, Maltese, Mathematics, Physics, and Biology.
- Qualified instruction access to qualified teachers and free study materials.
- Outreach strategy comprehensive outreach to promote the program and encourage applications.

Key outcomes:

- Significant reduction in early school leaving rates from 18,1 % (2012) to nearly 10 % (2023).
- 60 % of participants improve their grades; 89 % of applicants continue to post-secondary education.

Evidence of success: The initiative supports approximately 840 students annually, with over 5.500 beneficiaries since its inception, enhancing pass rates in SEC examinations and mitigating long-term NEET status.

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Continued Social Benefits for Unemployed Adults Over 23 with Illness or Childcare Responsibilities to Enrol in Full-Time Education

Objective: This initiative, established under Article 30, Sub article 6b (iii) of the Social Security Act (Cap. 318), provides non-contributory benefits to individuals over 23 years old who cannot work full-time due to illness or childcare responsibilities. This provision allows those receiving Social Assistance to enrol in full-time studies at the University of Malta (UOM) or Malta College of Arts, Science, and Technology (MCAST) and receive stipends without deductions from their benefits.

Target group: unemployed adults over 23 years old who cannot work full-time due to illness or childcare responsibilities and are recipients of Social Assistance.

Key components of the practice:

- **Social benefits protection** Participants can receive stipends or apprenticeship income without deductions from Social Assistance, ensuring financial stability while studying.
- Access to education encourages individuals dependent on social benefits to pursue tertiary education, improving their job prospects and skills.

Key outcomes:

- Increased enrolment in tertiary education among previously unemployed individuals.
- Improved employment prospects for participants, contributing to a more skilled workforce.
- Reduction of dependency on social benefits as participants gain qualifications for better job opportunities.

Evidence of success: The practice has enabled adults to pursue further education while maintaining financial support, thus improving their long-term employability.

Objective: To equip NEETs with essential skills and experience needed for green career pathways and empower them to transition into sustainable careers through specialized training and work placements in the green sector.

Target group: NEETs (25 - 29).

Key components of the practice:

- **Research insight** a comprehensive analysis of the skills for green jobs and the specific needs of NEETs, informing program design for Malta, Italy, and Lithuania.
- Research-based training:
- 1. **NEET course**: development of a 25-hour program focusing on green jobs.
- 2. **Training for PES staff:** 40-hour course to enhance support for green career pathways.
- **Practical experience** 240-hour (3-month) work placements in the green sector.
- **Personalized support and allowance** NEETs receive financial support for training and work placements to promote engagement and reduce barriers.
- Career empowerment equipping NEETs with skills for sustainable employment in the green sector.

Key outcomes:

- **Positive activation rates:** 16,12% in Malta, 18,59% in Italy, and 65,29% in Lithuania.
- **High success rates:** 43,4% of 242 participants moved into employment, further training, or other active labour market policies.

Evidence of success:

- Flexible design: adapted effectively to the diverse needs of Malta, Italy, and Lithuania
- **Unemployment reduction:** achieved a 10-12% point drop in unemployment rates among participants compared to a control group.
