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
ESCO adoption by DYPA

ESCO **MATCHING**

- For the adoption of ESCO, DYPA implemented the "MATCHING" project (**M**apping **A**rrangements and **T**ranscoding **C**hange **I**N Greece),
- The project received EU funding, from the European Program for Employment and Social Innovation (EaSI). The adoption was completed in **December 2021**
- The fifth level analysis of occupations was adopted for employers and job seekers, with the skills pillar included from day one for job seekers and later for employers.




The challenges

- Jobseekers: to increase their self-awareness and identify skills they have and skills they lack. Skills assessment is essential.
- Employers: to be more specific about what they are looking for and to be familiar with describing skills.
- Job counsellors: to explore and highlight the skills of the unemployed, and assist employers specify their recruitment needs and requirements.
- UI remains a challenge. The users should be helped to navigate the ESCO portal

**Use cases, ongoing projects

Use case - Counseling services in face to face and Online workshops

Workshops are organized online and face to face for jobseekers to help them with techniques for job searching, upcoming interviews and CV preparation.

New thematic workshops dedicated to the use of ESCO have been held since April 2024:

Use case - The matching tool of DYPA

An example from the business perspective:
Anna is an accountant and posts a vacancy

Occupation Assistant accountant

Location Attica

Education Vocational Diploma in Accounting

Exact match

Anna can choose to view the most relevant results or more expanded results.
The matching tool gives results based on the exact geographical location!

Results

The information of the proposed job seekers will be displayed: Their specific **occupation and skills**, their registered knowledge and details such as foreign languages and educational level.

Match

Two-way matching that takes into account the requirements of both parties. A matching report is available to both users.

Use case: AI “Digital Assistant” is under development

Within the new digital tool (chatbot), a dedicated subsystem based on ESCO (*ESCO Search/Recommender*) is being developed to support the exploration of skills and occupations.

This subsystem will be used to facilitate the identification and recording of a wide range of skills, beyond those linked to work experience, enabling users to select and present their skills and occupations according to ESCO's structure and terminology.

Occupation Predictions

home care aide

Home care aides provide personal assistance and promote autonomy, on a daily basis to individuals who are unable to take care of themselves due to illness, ageing or disability. They assist them with personal hygiene, feeding, communication or medication according to the health care professional's instructions.

gerontology social worker

Gerontology social workers provide assistance to elderly individuals and their families helping them to cope with their biopsychosocial needs. They help connecting the elderly with community resources by gathering information about the array of services available to them. Gerontology social workers assess their clients' needs, functional capacity and health problems and liaise with medical professionals when necessary.

residential home older adult care worker

Residential home older adult care workers counsel and support elderly who have physical or mental disabilities. They monitor their progress and provide them with care in a positive living environment. They liaise with the clients' families in order to arrange their visits.

community care case worker

Community care case workers perform assessment and care management. They organise domiciliary services to support vulnerable adults who are living with physical impairment or convalescing, aiming to improve their lives in the community and enabling them to live safely and independently at their own home.

Skill Predictions

provide professional care in nursing

Provide professional care, adequate to the health and nursing care needs of the individuals, families and groups, taking into account the scientific developments, as well as the quality and safety requirements established in accordance with the legal/professional conduct regulations.

empathise with the healthcare user

Understand the background of clients' and patients' symptoms, difficulties and behaviour. Be empathetic about their issues; showing respect and reinforcing their autonomy, self-esteem and independence. Demonstrate a concern for their welfare and handle according to the personal boundaries, sensitivities, cultural differences and preferences of the client and patient in mind.

assist patients with special needs

Respond appropriately and communicate effectively with patients with special needs such as learning disabilities and difficulties, physical disabilities, mental illness, memory loss, bereavement, terminal illness, distress or anger.

tend to elderly people

Help elderly people in their physical, mental, and social needs.

older adults' needs

The physical, mental, and social needs of frail, older adults.

apply nursing care in long-term care

Enable the promotion and the development of nursing care in long term care, co-morbidity and in situations of dependency in order to maintain individuals' personal autonomy and relationships with the environment in each moment of the health/illness process.

interact with healthcare users

Communicate with clients and their carer's, with the patient's permission, to keep them informed about the clients' and patients' progress and safeguarding confidentiality.

Recommended Skills

- [apply soldering techniques](#): Apply and work with a variety of techniques in the process of soldering, such as soft soldering, silver soldering, induction soldering, resistance soldering, pipe soldering, mechanical and aluminium soldering.
- [inspect quality of products](#): Use various techniques to ensure the product quality is respecting the quality standards and specifications. Oversee defects, packaging and sendbacks of products to different production departments.
- [resolve equipment malfunctions](#): Identify, report and repair equipment damage and malfunctions. Communicate with field representatives and manufacturers to obtain repair and replacement components.
- [electricity principles](#): Electricity is created when electric current flows along a conductor. It entails the movement of free electrons between atoms. The more free electrons are present in a material, the better this material conducts. The three main parameters of electricity are the voltage, current (ampère), and resistance (ohm).
- [inspect electrical supplies](#): Check electrical supplies for damage, moisture, loss or other problems.
- [provide documentation](#): Prepare and distribute documentation to ensure all people involved in the production receive relevant and up-to-date information.
- [measure electrical characteristics](#): Measure voltage, current, resistance or other electrical characteristics by using electrical measuring equipment such as multimeters, voltmeters, and ammeters.
- [apply coating to electrical equipment](#): Prepare and apply coating, such as conformal coating, to electrical equipment and its components to protect the equipment against moisture, high temperature, and dust.
- [electrical equipment regulations](#): The national and international regulations with regards to the use and manufacture of electrical equipment on the workfloor. These regulations provide rules and guidelines on topics such as general risk management, electrical equipment manufacture, electrical equipment testing, electrical equipment installation, warning labels, and certificates.
- [electromechanics](#): The engineering processes that combine electrical and mechanical engineering in the application of electromechanics in devices that need electricity to create mechanical movement or devices that create electricity by mechanical movement.
